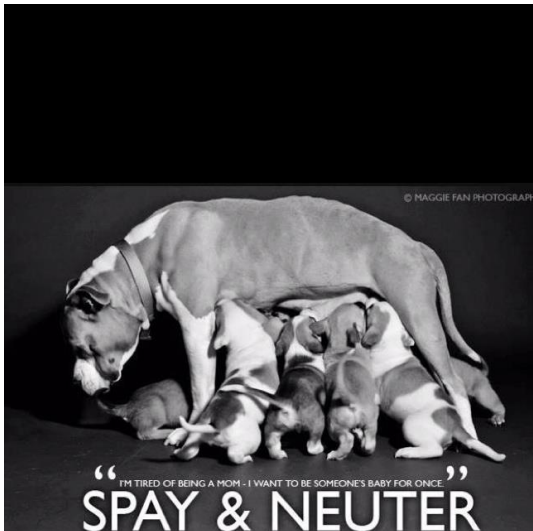

41.7 PERCENT

April 10, 2016 marked the 150th anniversary of the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, (ASPCA). The group can celebrate the fact that more cats and dogs are today acquired through rescue and shelter services - 41.7 percent - than by any other means.
