Freeman-Fritts poured love and care into 8 legs of fur and purr, rescuing them from a life of doom and gloom into the safe, loving Freeman-Fritts environment. These hero saviors calling their two little rescues Sundae and Parfait during their forever lifechanging 2nd leg of life.


Still suffering from the grief of losing our beloved Cinco, who fairly recently succumbed to cancer at age 13, I was startled to see Sundae's adoption picture on Kerrville Breaking News. He was a Freeman-Fritts kitty who looked just like a baby Cinco. Still too raw from his loss, we were not yet looking for a new kitty, and certainly were not looking to "replace" Cinco. Upon showing Sundae's photo to my husband, he surprised me when he said "call and see if the kitten has been adopted".











The next morning we went to meet Sundae, and there was an immediate connection! We also noticed Sundae having the time of his life playing with his sibling, Parfait. Jay, at Freeman-Fritts (aka Uncle Jay), told us that the two "share a brain". We simply couldn't think about separating them!

Once we were approved to adopt, we rushed to kitten-proof our house. Since their arrival at our home, the fun, love, and joy has not stopped. This second stage of magic in our home transitioned them to the 3rd round of names. Sundae, who is a totally laid-back, lovable, snuggly teddy bear, now is known as Teddy (with 2 alternating middles names: Boy and Bear). Teddy's name also fits since that was the name of our daughter's imaginary friend as a child, and, her now-vacant room has become their first kitty nursery, their room before being allowed access to other rooms. Parfait, who, to us, looks like an ocelot/bengal, was more than a sweet little "Parfait" dessert. While looking closely at him, I thought to myself "what is your name?", and it was as if he said "Hey, I'm Savvy!" And he is so very savvy, clever, funny, and loyal. His mission in life is to make us laugh. He also wants to be the helper-kitty. He's so helpful that we try to clean his litter box when he is not around, so he does not take over. And whenever I say "Savvy, give me a kiss", he shortly begins "headbutting" me in the face, and giving me his sweet kitty kisses!

Coming out of their previous hoarding situation, the brothers had to overcome some sniffles and sneezing. When Teddy Boy even starts to sneeze, Savvy runs over, places his arm (leg, paw, you get the idea...) around him, sometimes even trying to look up little Teddy Bear's nose! Little Dr. Savvy does the same to me if I sneeze!

Our family so appreciates the angels at Freeman-Fritts! The level of love and care the animals receive is remarkable. Our family has always been blessed with super-special pets, which comes from love and positive reinforcement. These



Fritts kittens, after having been rescued only 3 months before we adopted them, are amazing! With previous kittens, I had to work to train, nurture, and shape them. With our prior kittens, we had to teach them not to play with their claws out, often taking up to 1 1/2 years. That is not the case with our Freeman-Fritts rescues. Quickly they learned what a kitty post is, and they prefer that over furniture. In the mornings, when allowed to go outside into their enclosed kitty park, I just open their door to let them out, and they go straight through their kitty door into the kitty park, and return promptly when we're ready to get them back inside! While we have a history of cats minding us exceedingly well, we are amazed that young kittens actually came this way! We attribute this awesomeness to the special love and care from the angels at Freeman-Fritts, along with some unseen angels from above!
